esley United Methodist Church has glorified God with amazing and wonderful ministries and activities during the past year. Look at a few highlights that represent new or emerging activities, or those that have experienced significant

EQUIPPING MINISTRIES


- Missions continued to represent 20% of the operating budget after excluding operational overhead and debt service costs.
 We held the annual golf tournament in August, raising a record \$10,000 for Habitat for Humanity. We also initiated FaithWork intended to match members volunteering with missions' service opportunities.
- An Assimilation Ministry was created to connect and integrate the many new members joining our church.
- Evangelism launched Beacons of Light, a neighborhood ministry effort, to enable members to minister to other members within their neighborhoods.
- Great strides were taken in expanding Spiritual Gifts assessment, matching members God-given gifts, passions and talents with service opportunities.
- In its pilot program, 25 WUMC members graduated from UpWord Bound University, a nine-month long Christian leadership development program.

GROW MINISTRIES

- More than 200 persons have enrolled in Disciple Bible Study this fall, and more than 95 persons enrolled in Alpha Bible Study in its premier offering.
- In Children's Ministries, more than 120 youth and adult volunteers participated in Vacation Bible Camp. Four new programs were launched including Family Cornerstone, Kids Nite Out, 5th grade youth group and BLAST (Saturday and Sunday evening programs).
- Student Ministries launched Vertical, a mid-week worship experience.
- The Singles/Young Adult Ministry was restructured, and new leadership and servant teams were formed.
- Primetime Ministry for Senior Adults was launched.

The year-to-date average worship attendance of 677 has increased almost 10% over the same period last year.

WORSHIP AND CARING

- We continued to seek and reach more people for Christ through worship. The year-to-date average worship attendance of 677 has increased almost 10% over the same period last year.
- A Healing Service was held weekly for those seeking comfort and support during difficult life experiences.
- Music Ministry recruited and hired a new Director of Music and provided a number of concerts offering a wide variety of Christian music performances.
- Through Prayer Ministry, we received and prayed for more than 800 prayer requests and sent more than 350 personal notes to those submitting prayer requests.

GIVE MINISTRIES

- Finance supported Mission fund collection efforts including Share the Warmth, Golf Tournament and Tax Refund offerings in addition to handling memorials, regular operating and building offerings.
- Facilities implemented an on-line web based event scheduling system supporting the custodial requirements for activities that occur each day of the year.
- Information Technology implemented a dramatically improved and informational web-site.



Just how much should I give? What are the ranges at which others give?

any people seek to base their giving on what the "average" household gives. But defining the "average" household at Wesley United Methodist Church is not easy. We have young singles, retirees, newlyweds, single parents and two-parent families. We have those with limited incomes and those with very substantial incomes.

For this reason, it is best to base your giving not on what the average household might give, but on what God wants you to give. Here are a few principles that might help you as you consider your decision:

TITHING

The Bible teaches us the concept of tithing. To tithe is to give one-tenth of your earnings. The Bible also teaches that this should be the "first-fruits" or the first tenth of what you earn. For those who cannot tithe yet, we encourage you to begin giving proportionately. In other words, determine a set percentage of your income to give to God, making the tithe or tenth your goal.

STEPPING UP

Looking at the table, consider stepping up one level in 2007. For many this would only mean moving up 1% - 4%. The Stewardship Committee has determined that our 2007 proposed budget is well within our range if all of us 'step-up' in faith.

COMMITMENT TO CHRIST

Ultimately, your commitment should be reflective of both your income and your desire to live as a committed disciple of Jesus Christ.

GROW MINISTRIES

- Children's Ministry hopes to implement curriculum for Matthew's Ministries, a ministry for special needs children.
- Student Ministries expects to double the number of students participating in Vertical and other student programs.
- Three new ministries including Young Adult, Singles One and Singles Two with leaders, volunteers and servant teams devoted to each group are being developed.
- Disciple Bible Studies will be formed using the Companions in Christ series.
- Jubilees, a group for adults between 50 and 54 years of age, will be launched.
- Men's Ministries plans to create new small group opportunities for fellowship activities.
- Women's Ministries will hold the first ever Women's Conference at WUMC.

EQUIPPING MINISTRIES

- We hope to further develop the strategy and expand volunteer support required for successfully integrating new members into the congregation.
- We plan to expand and strengthen UpWord Bound University in its second year of operation.
- Missions Ministry hopes to introduce J-Walk, a web-based matching of members with volunteer opportunities.

WORSHIP/CARE

- We will continue to find ways to accommodate more people seeking a worship experience at WUMC.
- Prayer Ministries goals include guiding us to be a prayer-formed, prayer-led, and prayer-sent church and establishing a 24-hour Prayer Ministry.

GIVE MINISTRIES

- Finance will obtain required financing for the next phase of development and also plans to increase the number of members giving through automatic withdrawal.
- Through Facilities and Human Resources, we will continue to support the growing number of ministry events at WUMC and recruit and retain high quality employees with hearts of service.
- Information Technology hopes to implement web based video streaming of sermons and other major events.
